



KRAGGA KAMMA DROP-OFF SITE

The Kragga Kamma Waste Drop-off Site is the first in the Eastern Cape to be registered as such with the Department of Environmental Affairs and Tourism (DEDEAT) in terms of recent legislation.

The main purpose of this facility can be summarised as follows:

- Providing a drop-off facility for the use of surrounding residents, which will allow the disposal of certain categories of household waste that is not removed via the normal kerbside collection service (instead of disposal at remote licensed landfill sites) (Note: Kitchen waste is NOT to be dropped off at the Kragga Kamma site).
- The facility forms an integral component in the NMBM's Strategy to eliminate illegal dumping in the municipal area, in that the indiscriminate dumping of waste will be reduced.
- Encouraging waste separation at source and providing accessible facilities for the drop-off of such separated/recyclable material. This facility provides for the disposal of cans, cardboard, paper, plastic and glass.

No businesses will be allowed to dispose of any waste material at the drop-off site, except for garden services enterprises (disposal limit: one ton of waste per day only). Entrepreneurs removing waste from business premises will not be allowed to dispose of such waste at the drop-off site.

ACCEPTED WASTE:

A maximum of one bakkie load per day (max 1 ton) of:

- Residential garden refuse
- Bulky household waste not removed during kerbside collection (e.g. furniture)
- Pre-sorted recyclable waste (e.g. paper, cardboard, plastic, glass, metal and cans)

WASTE NOT ACCEPTED:

- Any waste generated by businesses or contractors
- Large tree stumps
- Branches longer than 2 m
- Construction waste (e.g. rubble, rock and soil)
- Kitchen waste (e.g. normal black bag waste), excluding recyclables
- Carcasses
- Liquid waste
- Anything that could cause a bad smell
- Hazardous waste, incl:
 - o Oils & paints
 - o Batteries & fluorescent light bulbs
 - o Electronic waste
 - o Medical waste, etc

Waste not accepted is to be taken to the Arlington Waste Disposal Site.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE ABOVE MAY RESULT IN A FINE OF R2000 PER INCIDENT

Site will be open seven days a week (except on 25 December) and operating times will be from 7h30 to 17h00.
